Across Kisumu, Gatundu, and Mutunguru campuses, recent visits have enabled us to review academic programmes, infrastructure projects, staff welfare, and institutional performance, while reinforcing a culture of accountability, teamwork, and student-centred service.

This issue also highlights the strong support we continue to receive from communities through bursaries, cheque handovers, land donations, green energy investments, and Board visits that combine governance oversight with environmental stewardship. Student welfare remains central to our agenda, with the Affordable Housing Programme providing a major boost through the development of Students' Village Hostels in several campuses to ease accommodation pressure and enhance the learning environment.

The February bulletin coincides with the ongoing March 2026 intake, with vacancies opened in a wide range of Diploma and Certificate programmes across KMTC campuses. I encourage all eligible prospective students, including KCSE leavers from previous cohorts, to seize this opportunity and submit their applications within the stipulated timelines.

College Strengthens Mandate through Training Workshop

The College has reaffirmed its commitment to delivering a 360-degree execution of its mandate through transformative training, research, and consultancy by concluding a three-day Consultancy Training Workshop that brought together participants from all KMTCC campuses.

The workshop, led by industry experts, brought together senior managers, principals, and staff to build institutional capacity in consultancy development, positioning the College to expand its footprint in research and professional advisory services locally, across Africa, and globally.

KMTCC is globally recognized as a leading institution for middle-level health training, ranking ahead of several universities in the Webometrics global rankings. The College's mandate is to develop fit-for-purpose middle-level health professionals through transformative training, research, and consultancy, and this workshop marked a strategic step toward strengthening the research and consultancy pillar.

Participants were trained on key consultancy domains, including health training and curriculum development, research and monitoring and evaluation, health systems strengthening, data and technology integration, community health engagement, institutional development and strategic planning, international partnerships, and mental health and psychosocial wellbeing. The training emphasized problem-based learning approaches and innovation-driven consultancy models, drawing on global best practices while responding to African health system needs.

The workshop also highlighted the need for KMTCC to establish a structured consultancy database and institutional framework to continuously map expertise and track consultancy engagements. Experts challenged the College to move beyond survival mode and adopt a thriving, innovation-driv-

en culture, emphasizing that excellence requires deliberate effort beyond routine operations.

In his closing remarks, CEO Dr. Kelly Oluoch challenged the College fraternity to accelerate the development of internal research and consultancy capacity, noting that while KMTCC has excelled in training, gaps remain in research and consultancy delivery. He acknowledged that the College is still at an early stage in its consultancy journey but described the initiative as a bold and strategic step forward.

"It is time for KMTCC to develop its own capacity in research and consultancy. While we acknowledge that we are at the infancy stage, we have started this bold journey," the CEO said, commending principals, managers, and staff for their commitment to advancing the College's mandate.

The CEO further urged participants to explore emerging frontiers such as digital transformation in medical education, lifelong learning systems, and health innovation incubation, positioning KMTCC as a continental hub for health innovation and consultancy. He cited previous consultancy engagements, including projects on improving maternal and newborn health, as a foundation for scaling future institutional consultancy work.

Consultancy experts also challenged KMTCC to pursue continental and international consultancy markets, advocating for long-term tender frameworks, decentralized campus-based consultancy units, and the establishment of a Business Development and Innovation Centre to incubate health solutions and enterprise-driven innovations.

With Africa and the global market increasingly demanding health innovation hubs, KMTCC was identified as uniquely positioned to fill this gap, leveraging its national footprint, curriculum development expertise, and strong health work-

force training legacy.

The consultancy training workshop marks a strategic milestone in KMTC's journey toward becoming a leading African centre for health training, research, consultancy, and

innovation, reinforcing the College's commitment to delivering transformative impact in healthcare education and health systems strengthening.

KEBS Trains KMTC Internal Auditors

The College has taken another significant step toward strengthening institutional quality assurance. More than 100 staff drawn from campuses across the country have undertaken audit training facilitated by the Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) at the Kenya School of Government (KSG) Embu.

The participants, comprising teaching and non-teaching staff, Campus Principals, management teams, Corporate Management Representatives, security officers, and administrative personnel, completed the training and sat for the internal audit examination.

The assessment marks the culmination of a week-long intensive training facilitated by KEBS experts, designed to strengthen KMTC's internal audit capacity and reinforce adherence to international quality management standards.

Throughout the training, participants engaged in interactive sessions, practical exercises, group discussions, and continuous assessments focused on applying ISO 19011:2018 Guidelines for Management Systems Auditing.

The course equipped staff with the knowledge and practical skills required to conduct effective internal audits within a Quality Management System aligned to ISO 9001:2015 standards.

Speaking on the initiative, KMTC CEO Dr. Kelly Oluoch said the programme reflects the College's deliberate investment in staff capacity as a foundation for quality service de-

livery. "This training strengthens our staff's understanding of critical processes and auditing principles. It ensures that our operations, from teaching and research to service delivery, remain efficient, compliant, and continuously improving," he said.

Participants described the programme as practical and impactful. Dr. Jacinta Mukonzo, Principal of KMTC Mombasa, noted that the training had enhanced their ability to implement ISO standards effectively across campuses. "It has equipped us with practical skills to strengthen quality assurance processes and reinforces our shared commitment to delivering consistent, high-quality services," she said.

KMTC has maintained ISO 9001:2015 certification for 17 years, during which the College has strengthened operational efficiency, accountability, and service delivery through a structured Quality Management System.

KEBS, established under the Standards Act CAP 496, provides certification, testing, and training services that support institutions in maintaining internationally recognized standards. The examination milestone underscores KMTC's continued commitment to professionalism, accountability, and continuous improvement in health training and education.

The training was coordinated by the Deputy Registrar, Quality Assurance, Ms. Lucy Kuria, the Management Representative.

Mombasa Campus Hosts Mvita MP Hon. Machele Mohamed

On February 4, 2026, Mombasa Campus hosted Mvita MP Hon. Machele Mohamed for discussions on partnerships to support the campus's growth.

The MP, accompanied by County Executive Committee Member for Youth and Sports Hon. Jonathan Wepukhulu and officials from his office, was received by the campus leadership. Talks focused on campus expansion, student support, and partnerships that benefit both learners and surrounding communities.

The MP committed to allocating additional resources to complete the Mvita block, a project initiated earlier by the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) Mvita Constituency.

Mombasa Campus Principal Dr. Jacinta Mukonzo briefed

the delegation on the student population, which currently stands at about 2,500 learners enrolled in various programmes.

“We appreciate the continued support from our leaders, which strengthens our ability to provide quality training and a conducive learning environment for our students,” she said.

Dr. Mukonzo also requested support for the construction of two additional floors to ease space constraints.

In response, Hon. Machele directed the Clerk of Works to prepare a bill of quantities and committed to fund the construction of one floor, a step expected to reduce pressure on facilities as enrolment grows.

“Education and health training are key pillars of community development. Supporting KMTc means investing directly in the future of healthcare services in our constituency and beyond,” Hon. Machele noted.

The MP further pledged to sponsor between 20 and 30 students from Mvita Constituency and an additional 20 Community Health Promoters in the upcoming March intake, widening access to health training.

Student accommodation challenges were also discussed, with a follow-up meeting proposed to explore the development of a hostel.

Molo Campus Set for Major Infrastructure Upgrade

Molo Campus is set to receive a major infrastructure upgrade to enhance the learning environment and student experience. The development includes the construction of a modern administration block and a new students' village.

The plans were announced on January 30, 2026, during a campus tour by the area MP, Hon. Kimani Kuria, whom the CEO, Kelly Oluoch, received.

During the visit, Hon. Kuria also assured the Campus of additional improvements, including cabro works on the access road to enhance mobility and accessibility within the Campus. He confirmed that resources will be allocated in the next financial year to support the projects, noting that his office will continue working closely with the College.

He emphasized that the investment supports youth devel-

opment and strengthens healthcare capacity in the region. The MP reiterated his commitment to transforming KMTC Molo into a centre of excellence for health training.

On his part, Dr. Oluoch reassured students and staff of the College's continued focus on welfare and academic success. He highlighted the importance of access to student loan facilities, such as the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), noting that financial stability is key to helping students stay focused on their studies. The CEO further announced that

the Campus is expected to receive a bus in the next financial year to support student transport to clinical placement sites.

Beyond infrastructure, he encouraged students to remain disciplined, work hard, and value humble beginnings as part of their journey toward professional success.

Also present during the visit were the Registrar, Mr. Ronald Wasike, the Acting Administration Manager, Dr. Pricillah Anuri, and the Principal of Molo Campus, Mr. Richard Korir.

CEO Visits Kisumu Campuses to Review Academic and Infrastructure Progress

Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Kelly Oluoch, visited KMTC campuses in Kisumu County on February 13, 2026, to review academic programmes, ongoing infrastructure projects, staff welfare, and overall institutional performance.

The visit began at KMTC Kombewa, where the CEO met the Campus Principal, staff, and students. He thereafter proceeded to KMTC Lake Victoria for similar engagements with campus leadership and the student community.

During the meetings, Dr. Oluoch reiterated the College's commitment to staff welfare, professional accountability, and efficient service delivery as important components of institutional performance.

He emphasized the need for staff to remain committed to duty and to align with the College's strategic objectives to sustain quality training across all campuses.

A key focus of the visit was a review of ongoing infrastructure projects under the College's KShs. 1.37 billion development programmes. The CEO assessed the status of tuition

blocks, skills laboratories, libraries, administrative facilities, and student hostels, noting progress made and encouraging timely completion to improve the learning environment and expand training capacity.

Student welfare and continuity of learning were also discussed.

He highlighted the importance of safety and security, adequacy of learning facilities, strengthened library resources, and the provision of quality teaching, noting that academic excellence and student success remain central to the College's mandate.

The CEO further reviewed campus-specific priorities and outlined measures to address critical development needs, aligning infrastructure improvements with academic quality and supporting services.

The Kisumu visit formed part of KMTC's broader efforts to strengthen health training and provide a conducive environment for staff and students across its network of campuses.

CEO Visits Gatundu and Mutunguru Campuses

CEO Dr. Kelly Oluoch made a visit to the Gatundu Constituency in Kiambu County on February 9, 2026, to assess campus operations and explore ways to enhance institutional efficiency, service delivery, and student welfare.

The visit was part of the CEO's ongoing transformative leadership agenda to strengthen academic excellence, infrastructure development, and strategic partnerships across KMTc campuses. During the engagement, Dr. Oluoch also visited Mutunguru Satellite Campus, which operates under Gatundu Campus, to assess training facilities and the learning environment.

Accompanied by members of the KMTc Management team, Dr. Oluoch held interactive sessions with campus leadership, staff, and students to identify priority areas for improvement and reinforce the College's performance framework. KMTc Gatundu Campus currently serves 1,158 students, while Mutunguru Satellite Campus hosts 173 students pursuing various health-related courses.

Key focus areas during the visit included infrastructure expansion, student clinical placements, staff and student welfare, campus safety, internet connectivity, and partnerships

with local health facilities and community stakeholders. Among the immediate priorities identified were the construction of additional classrooms, the modernization of library resources, and the enhancement of security systems to create a more conducive learning environment.

"Our focus is to ensure that every KMTc campus operates efficiently and effectively, with adequate infrastructure, strong partnerships, and a supportive environment for both students and staff," said Dr. Oluoch.

The CEO commended student leaders championing campaigns against drug and substance abuse and urged the College community to remain vigilant in addressing the "Triple Threat" affecting young people - new HIV infections, adolescent pregnancies, and gender-based violence.

In his closing remarks, Dr. Oluoch underscored the importance of teamwork and a shared sense of purpose, emphasizing that collective success is built on collaboration. "We can only succeed together. We are gifted in different ways, and our joint efforts strengthen our ability to excel," he remarked. He encouraged students to stay resilient, pursue excellence, and uphold the KMTc spirit wherever they go, reaffirming Management's commitment to their success.

KMTC Holds Consultative Meeting with Clinical Officers Council

KMTC outlined key priorities on February 12, 2026, aimed at strengthening Clinical Medicine and Surgery training during a three-day consultative meeting with the Clinical Officers Council (COC) in Machakos County.

Speaking on behalf of the CEO, Dr. Kelly Oluoch, the Deputy Director, Finance, Planning and Administration, Ms. Lucy Chebungei, noted that demand for Clinical Medicine programmes remains high despite the College's capacity constraints. "The demand for Clinical Medicine continues to grow, and as an institution, we must align our capacity with national health workforce needs," she said.

Ms. Chebungei observed that some enrolled students have not yet been fully indexed in regulatory and national systems, which has affected their clinical placements and progression.

"Timely indexing is critical to ensure our students transition smoothly into clinical training and complete their programmes without unnecessary delays," she emphasized.

On campus accreditation, she stated that the College is seeking approval to accredit additional campuses to offer the Clinical Medicine programme, with plans to expand access beginning in March 2026.

"Expanding accreditation will allow us to increase access while maintaining quality standards," she noted.

Regarding faculty capacity, Ms. Chebungei proposed appointing contracted lecturers to reduce the student-lecturer ratio and enhance supervision during practical and clinical training.

"Strengthening faculty support will improve supervision and safeguard the quality of hands-on clinical instruction," she added.

In response, COC CEO and Registrar Mr. Ibrahim Wako welcomed the proposals and reaffirmed the Council's commitment to upholding regulatory standards.

"Our mandate is to ensure institutions meet the required standards so that we produce competent and ethical clinical officers," he said.

The meeting, which kicked off on Tuesday, brought together leadership from KMTC, the Clinical Officers Council, and the Ministry of Health to deliberate on accreditation requirements, regulatory compliance, curriculum alignment, and strategies to strengthen training quality.

Dr. Saleh Bardad, Head of Specialized Clinical Services at the Ministry of Health, underscored the central role of clinical officers in delivering essential health services, particularly in underserved areas. "Strong collaboration between regulators and training institutions is key to sustaining quality and protecting public safety," he stated.

KMTC, KNPHI Forge Strategic Partnership to Strengthen Kenya's Public Health Systems

KMTC is set to partner with the Kenya National Public Health Institute (KNPHI) in a landmark collaboration to strengthen Kenya's preventive and promotive health systems through workforce development, specialized training, and enhanced preparedness for public health emergencies. The engagement follows a high-level courtesy visit by KMTC leadership to KNPHI's Afya Annex offices, led by Deputy Director, Finance, Planning and Administration, Ms. Lucy Chebungei, who represented the CEO, Dr. Kelly Oluoch. The discussions centred on aligning institutional capacities to support national priorities in disease prevention, surveillance, and health security.

During her speech at the event, Ms. Chebungei highlighted KMTC's key role in developing a skilled health workforce and promoting preventive care across the country. "KMTC remains committed to training health professionals who not only treat disease but prevent it. This partnership enables us to strengthen national preparedness by equipping frontline workers with the skills needed to detect, respond to, and mitigate public health threats."

The College highlighted its readiness to support the collaboration through short courses in epidemiology and disease surveillance, as well as specialized training in public health, nutrition, and community health, key pillars in advancing Universal Health Coverage.

Welcoming the partnership, KNPHI Acting Director General Mr. Kamene Kimenyé noted that collaboration with training institutions is critical to building a resilient health system.

"A strong public health system depends on a well-trained, agile workforce. Partnering with KMTC allows us to scale capacity nationwide and ensure Kenya is better prepared for current and emerging health threats."

The two institutions identified several priority areas for collaboration, including: public health workforce development, disease surveillance and response, research and innovation, laboratory systems strengthening, emergency preparedness and health security, Health information and data management, and community health systems strengthening.

KMTC Advances Nutrition Training Through Curriculum Validation

KMTC completed a validation workshop for the Certificate in Nutrition and Dietetics curriculum, reaffirming its commitment to ongoing quality improvement, standardization, and regulatory compliance.

Hosted by Karen Campus, a Centre of Excellence in Nutrition and Dietetics, the workshop brought together curriculum experts, regulators, county

government officials, and academic leaders to review and enrich the existing curriculum in line with emerging industry trends and best practices

In his closing remarks, CEO Dr. Kelly Oluoch underscored the importance of consistent curriculum implementation and strict adherence to regulatory requirements.

“We must ensure that standardized units are taught properly and uniformly across all campuses. We must also remain keen on meeting regulatory compliance in curriculum execution and campus infrastructure,” said Dr. Oluoch.

He further noted that curriculum quality and relevance are key drivers of graduate employability.

“What will position KMTC graduates at the top of the job

market compared to others is the quality, relevance, and standardization of their training,” he added.

Speaking on behalf of The African Population and Health Research Center (APHRC), Project Execution Plan coordinator Mr. Jarim Omogi, highlighted the importance of maintaining harmonized training manuals and integrating standardized content into e-learning platforms to strengthen digital and blended learning.

The workshop was led by Dr. Peris Kibet, Principal of KMTC Karen Campus, and attended by the Academic Registrar, Mr. Ronald Wasike, and the Deputy Registrar (Curriculum), Mr. David Wafula, alongside other key stakeholders.

Chwele Campus Conducts Medical Camp in Partnership with Local Church

For many participants, it was a truly rewarding experience that reinforced the core values of service and empathy essential to healthcare practice.

The partnership also strengthened ties between the College and the local community, demonstrating the impact of collaborative efforts in improving access to basic health services.

Marsabit County Health Team Sensitizes Students During Drug Abuse Week

As part of Drug Abuse Week activities, Marsabit Campus on February 13, 2026, hosted a multidisciplinary County Health Team that was conducting World Condom Day outreach across institutions in the county. The forum brought together key stakeholders, including officers from the National Authority for the Campaign Against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA), mental health specialists, HIV/AIDS coordinators, mentor mothers, and staff from the Comprehensive Care Clinic (CCC).

The team was led by County Multisectoral Coordinator Wario Galgallo, alongside NACADA Sub-County Officer Mohamed Wako, Clinical Psychologist Victor Karani, and Mentor Roselyn Nyeusi.

Held on campus, the session focused on critical aspects of student wellness, including HIV prevention, responsible decision-making, substance abuse awareness, and mental health support.

Opening the discussions, Mr. Galgallo emphasized personal responsibility in safeguarding health and future prospects, noting that prevention remains the most effective defense against HIV infection. “Your health is your wealth, protect it today to secure your future tomorrow,” he emphasized.

Addressing substance abuse, Mr. Wako highlighted how alcohol and drugs impair judgment and increase vulnerabili-

ty to risky behaviors, emphasizing “Substance abuse doesn’t solve problems; it multiplies them and steals your dreams.”

Clinical Psychologist Mr. Karani spoke on the mental health challenges facing young people, urging students to seek help early and support one another. He noted that “Mental strength is not about enduring pain in silence, but about having the courage to ask for help.”

Ms. Nyeusi encouraged students to make informed choices in their relationships and personal lives. “Every responsible choice you make today builds a healthier life for tomorrow.”

Collectively, the facilitators emphasized that HIV prevention, freedom from substance abuse, and positive mental health are interconnected pillars of student success and overall well-being. The session concluded with an interactive dialogue, providing students an opportunity to ask questions, share concerns, and access guidance from the specialists.

Following the visit by the county team, Marsabit campus Principal Dr. Agnes Mutuma expressed gratitude, saying that “We appreciate the County Health team for this timely and holistic engagement with our students. Such partnerships are vital in nurturing not only academically competent trainees but also healthy, responsible individuals who are well-prepared to serve society.”
