KMTC remains the lead middle level health trainer in East Africa and beyond. We address health workforce needs by contributing over 85% of the local middle level human resources for the health sector, by releasing an average of 10,000 graduands every year.

Today, the College will graduate 4,114 Graduands who will contribute to the human resources for health in the country, a key milestone in attainment of Universal Health Coverage and Sustainable Development Goal 3. An additional **8,114** final year students whose learning was abruptly disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic will however miss out on this year's graduation.

KMTC remains a major exporter of health workforce with our graduates working in far off countries in Europe, Australia and USA. This means we directly contribute to national development through diaspora remittances and investments.

The College has continued to embrace a culture of good corporate governance, performance contracting and quality management systems, thus recording tremendous achievements over the years.

The achievements include: growth in the College asset base, establishment of new campuses, recruitment of more staff to support the growing number of students, uptake of research activities, enhanced terms and conditions of service, training, staff rewards as well as strengthening of Campus resource centres and transport systems.

In line with the Board's transformative expansion agenda, the College continues to grow at an impressive rate. Five new Campuses: Mandera, Sigowet, Imenti, Taveta and Mbooni were operationalized, bringing the total number of KMTC campuses to 71 spread across 43 out of the 47 Counties in the country. By this, we have created additional opportunities to train competent health professionals to bridge the human resource for health gaps in the country.

Even as we grow, the College remains committed to excellence, ISO standards as well as regulatory frameworks.

The Board has ensured uptake of Enterprise Resource Planning, as well as Elearning to support and strengthen teaching, learning and service delivery.

Towards ensuring students have the best environment for learning, the Board has spearheaded infrastructural development and further strengthened transport systems to ease mobility of faculty and students to clinical placement sites. Last year, the College acquired 62 vehicles (36 buses, 24 double cabins and two land cruisers), towards this course.

The Board has enhanced resource mobilization initiatives and strengthened collaboration for mutually beneficial outcomes and sustainability.

Our collaboration with County Governments, National Government Constituency Development Fund and other partners has resulted to growth in land, infrastructure, equipment and secondment of staff.

To provide clinical training and internship opportunities for our students, we have partnered with over 450 hospitals and health facilities.

To our esteemed partners, we owe you immense debt of gratitude. You have supported us through; capacity building, equipping our Campuses with teaching and learning resources, exchange programmes and curriculum development.
