## Procurement in KMTC

Kenya Medical Training College conducts procurement of either goods, works or services. The procurement is geared towards addressing the national (Big four agenda and specifically the Universal Health Coverage (UHC) being a key pillar).

In this regard, KMTC of which has a total of 71 campuses applies both the centralized and decentralized forms of procurement. All procurement spend which is 500,000/= and above is handled at either level though the final awarding is done centrally at the KMTC headquarters by the Director/CEO.

The campuses are mandated to award procurements whose value does not exceed Kshs. 500,000/=.

Members of the general public are advised to note that KMTC advertises its Tenders in the websites ([www.kmtc.ac.ke](http://www.kmtc.ac.ke) and [www.tenders.go.ke](http://www.tenders.go.ke)) and the print media specifically in the “my government” paper and are requested to check regularly in the newspapers. Currently, such adverts appear on Tuesdays.

The interested members of the public that wish to participate in the said procurement under Preferences and Reservations are urged to observe full compliance on the existing Public Procurement Legal Framework.

To this end, you are advised to operate within what is enshrined in the Public Procurement and Assets Disposal Act of 2015 and the Public Procurement and Assets Disposal Regulations, 2020.

In relation to the same, while submitting the bidding documents, they shall always be attached with the following mandatory documents;
