elcome to regular updates regarding key milestones and achievements of the College over the course of June and August, 2022.

These were the busiest months on our calendar.

It is the period we recorded immense milestones in the areas of strengthening teaching and learning.

A major development has been the establishment of an education financing scheme for needy students.

The College edged closer to securing Ksh. 648 million funding from the National Treasury to cater to students' fees.

As part of actualizing this dream, we have signed a service contract with the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) to operationalize the financing scheme.

Besides that, we continue to source new partnerships with other organizations to push forward our agenda of promoting teaching and learning.

We must also empower our biggest asset - our employees.

To do so, we will continue to ensure a safe working environment and continual capacity building. We will also ensure student-staff ratios are bridged accordingly to ease service delivery.

For this reason, we advertised for various jobs and we encourage members of the public to apply and join the institution.

In addition, staff welfare is at the heart of our operations, I am proud of the actions we are undertaking to meet staff needs.

In particular, during the months, we entered an agreement with the Kenya Union of Domestic Hotels Educational Institutions Hospitals & Allied Workers (KUDHEIHA) to represent staff in labor negotiations.

Similarly, we fully settled the Collective Bargaining Agreement for a period of four (4) cycles.

On academic matters, the College conducted its Final Qualified Examination (FQE) for 11,038 registered candidates in the month of June and July.

ealth Cabinet Secretary Sen. Mutahi Kagwe has urged the Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC) to expand training for Nutritionists and Dieticians to meet local and global market demands.

While acknowledging the important role played by nutritionists in fighting Covid-19 and other nutritionrelated disease, Sen. Kagwe noted that the country is facing acute shortage of such specialists.

"Currently, the ratio of Nutritionists and Dieticians to patients stands at 1:100, 000 which is below the required World Health Organization (WHO) recommended numbers," he reported.

he government has challenged the Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC) to set up an Italian language course in the College to prepare students for foreign jobs.

Health Cabinet Secretary Sen. Mutahi Kagwe said that the government will continue to expand job opportunities for unemployed Kenyans following the signing of a bilateral agreement with the United Kingdom and Italian governments.

"As you are aware, we are not going to send anybody to Italy who cannot speak the Italian language. That is why we are banking on KMTC to introduce Italian language course," he said.
