KMTC Holds 91st Graduation Ceremony,

Releases 15,915 Medics into the Health Sector

MTC during its 91st Graduation Ceremony held on December 2, 2022 released 15,915 fresh graduates ready to meet the health workforce gaps. Of this number, 692 were awarded Higher Diplomas, 8,235 Diplomas, and 6,988 Certificates.

The event presided over by the Health Cabinet Secretary Ms. Susan Nakhumicha Wafula, saw the highest-ever number of graduates in the history of the College given the power to put their training to work.

Giving her remarks, the CS observed that KMTC has been making great strides in the field of health care service delivery, "Anyone making contact with a health provider in this country and beyond, will most probably be attended by a KMTC graduate. I am proud to be a KMTC Alumna," she said.

KMTC Commits to Work with Regulatory Bodies and Professional Associations to Enhance Training

MTC has received a mostly clean bill of health on its quality of training according to a preliminary audit report by the Clinical Officers' Council of Kenya (COC) presented to the College on January 19, 2023.

As part of the quality control mechanism, the COC undertook an audit exercise on the College to assess its training programmes in March last year.

The COC Chairperson Prof. Joseph Kang'ethe lauded KMTC for having a standardized curriculum and teaching timetable across its Campuses spread across the country.

In addition, he reported that the placement of Campuses offering Clinical Medicine programmes next to health facilities, which had adequate clinical and medical officers, specialists as well as consultants, had enabled students to acquire the required skills.
