It gives me and the entire Board pleasure to welcome you to the 87<sup>th</sup> Annual Graduation Ceremony of the Kenya Medical Training College – the largest and biggest government owned mid-level health training institution in East Africa and beyond.

Let me take this opportunity to congratulate our 12,621 Graduands who through hard work and determination, have successfully completed their training. We sincerely thank our faculty, the parents, guardians and development partners for the immense support to the Graduands to pursue their studies to completion.

Allow me to thank you and express our deep appreciation and gratitude for honoring us with your presence as you officiate this significant occasion. This year's graduation theme: "Training Health Professionals Towards Accessible Universal Health Coverage (UHC)" underscores our commitment and conviction that these graduands are ready to positively impact the health sector in our country and beyond.

Established in 1927, KMTC remains the lead-trainer in the medical field producing over 85% of middle level health professionals for the local health sector. In any health facility you go to in Kenya and even internationally, you will not miss to find a KMTC graduate or trainee. KMTC graduates are highly sought after and work in far off countries in the USA, Canada, Australia, the UK, other Western Countries, Middle East and in Africa, just to mention but a few.

Over the years, the Board has embedded and strengthened the culture of good governance to ensure compliance with existing laws and regulations.

As a result, during the 10<sup>th</sup> Champions of Governance 2019 award ceremony, KMTC was once again awarded the 1<sup>st</sup> Runners up position in the Public Bodies Sector category.

The areas that were considered for the award were; transparency & disclosure, accountability, risk management & internal controls, ethical leadership and corporate citizenship, shareholder rights and obligations, stakeholder relationships, sustainability and performance management, compliance with laws and regulations.

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This is proof that the Board has embraced and upheld sound corporate governance practices and provided of able leadership for efficient service delivery.

Today's graduation ceremony is a significant mark of growth to the College.

In line with the Governments Universal Health Coverage goals and the Board's transformative agenda, the College has started 43 new campuses, increasing the number from 28 in 2013 to 71 in 2019. Some of the newly established Campuses include: Mbooni, Imenti, Othaya, Ugenya, Mandera, Sigowet (Kericho), Lodwar, Kuria, Molo, Lamu, Isiolo and Taveta. Our campuses are strategically placed adjacent to referral hospitals thus providing human resource to over 450 hospitals, which are our clinical training sites.

This expansion has ensured we are on the right path towards bridging the human resource for health gaps as a contribution to achieving UHC goals by 2022 as envisioned by the government. The graduands before us represent the face of Kenya and are ready to transform the health sector in their communities.

To ensure equity in access of training opportunities, the Board has established admission desks in all campuses to support admissions at the local community level. As a result, the College admitted 12,942 new students in the Academic Year 2018/19, growing the student population from about 19,358 in 2013 to over 41,459.

The expansion has led to an increase in the number of graduands over the years, with the College releasing 12,621 graduands, an increase from last year where we graduated 10,689. In the next four years, KMTC plans to produce over 50,000 graduates to support the agenda of achieving UHC for all Kenyans by 2022.

To enhance teaching and learning, and ensure students have a conducive learning environment, the Board has continued to allocated resources for academic strengthening, infrastructural development and corporate branding. The College successfully transited from ISO 9001: 2008 to the new standard of ISO 9001: 2015, which has given our graduands an advantage as they are internationally recognized and can work in any part of the world.

To transform the institution in service delivery, the Board has spearheaded transport reforms, where this year alone, we added 31 new buses and 12 double cabins for use by our students and faculty to access clinical training sites.

The Board instituted reforms leading to re-categorization of the College from PC2 to PC 4A level in State Corporations ranking, and as such our mandate was expanded to include that of research in addition to training and consultancy.

I am happy to report that our faculty and staff have benefited and I thank government for the support in budgetary allocations.

The Board has initiated collaborations with County Governments, National Government Constituency Development Fund(s) and other partners, through which the College has recorded growth in land, infrastructure, equipment and secondment of staff, in support of teaching and training.

In a special way, I would like to appreciate our partners for the unwavering support accorded to KMTC that has enabled us deliver on our mandate. These invaluable partners include Beyond Zero, World Bank, St. John's Ambulance, USAID, DFID(UK), WHO, DANIDA, Afya JIJINI Project, MSH, UKAID, UNICEF, Fred Hollows Foundation, Liverpool School of Tropical

Medicine, Kenya Association of People with Epilepsy, Karolinska Institute, Book Aid International, AMREF, the Jackson's Foundation (USA), African Development Bank and Rattansi Foundation.
